Achieve Opportunity is our name for Community and Employment Support (CES) Waiver, often called "Medicaid waiver" or "IDD waiver".

Achieve Opportunity provides 1:1 support in the client's home, providing the support needed to maintain independence and build self-care skills. This program is offered through approval from the Department of Human Services (DHS). DHS takes applications year-round, although there is a long wait list for approval of services. Once approved for CES Waiver, families can contact Achieve Community Alliance to get setup with a caregiver, or you can choose to bring your own caregiver to Achieve Opportunity. If you choose to bring your own caregiver, they'll need to be hired through our typical HR hiring process, including background checks and orientation. We would love to talk with you today about getting setup on Achieve Opportunity!

At the appointment, you will meet with a vocational counselor who will start the process of determining if you are eligible for services. The applicant is usually determined eligible or ineligible within 60 days. A person is eligible if he/she has a disability and requires vocational rehabilitation services to prepare for, secure, retain, or regain employment.

The CALL focuses on recruiting, training, and shepherding prospective families through the certification process. The interview is video recorded to reduce the number of times a child must share their trauma and to provide investigators with accurate, reliable information.

Children who require medical care are seen onsite by a specialized Pediatric Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) in a child-focused exam room. In addition, trained Child & Family Advocates provide ongoing support to non-offending caregivers by helping them understand the investigative process, connecting them to resources, assisting with victim compensation claims, and ensuring that each family’s unique needs are addressed throughout their journey.

Grandma’s House also connects children and families to trauma-informed mental health services, including referrals to specialized therapists who provide evidence-based treatment for child abuse survivors.

Beyond direct services, Grandma’s House works to prevent child abuse through education. and outreach. Staff provide awareness and prevention programs to schools, churches, businesses, and other community organizations across the region.
